The Kentucky Health Center Network (KHCN) is the membership organization of Kentucky's Health Centers. Initially funded in 2012 with 18 member organizations, KHCN now has 27 member organizations.

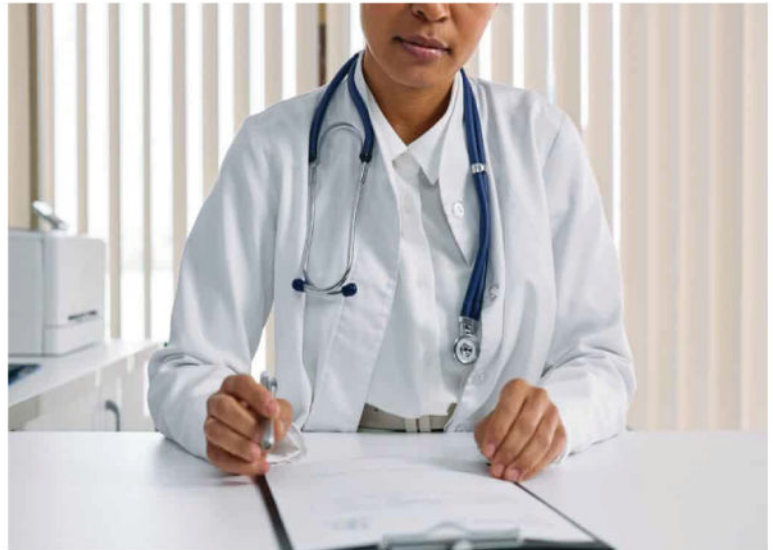


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## Our Mission is to sustain Kentucky Community Health Centers and their capacity to provide quality patient services, institute best practices, and pursue continuous improvement.
