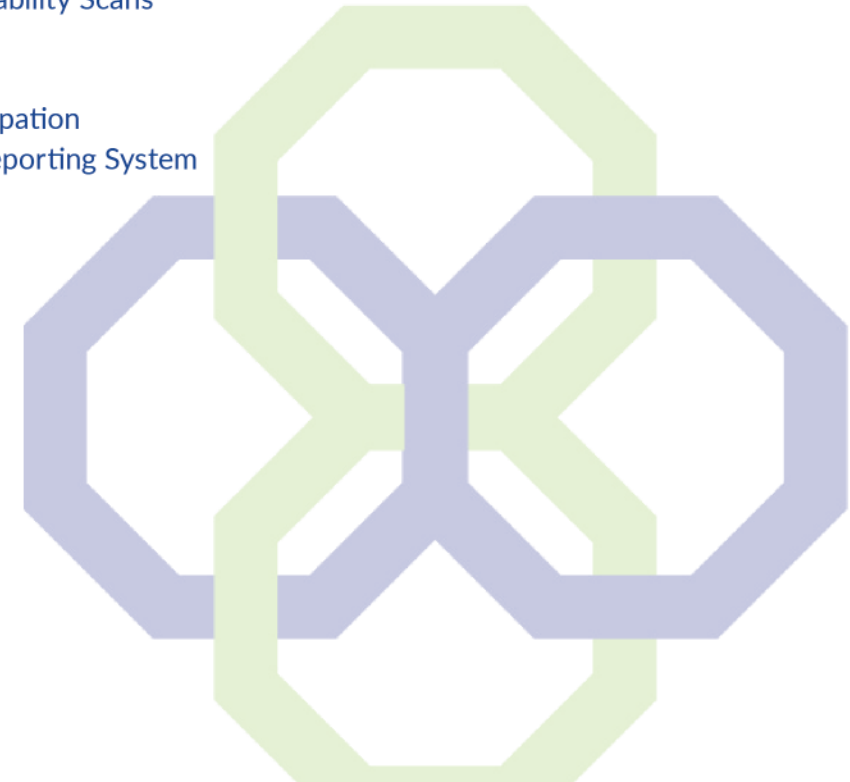

IN 2023, KHCCN...

- Member organizations served **611,775** unique patients at **629** clinic sites in **four states**.

- Had a successful Operational Site Visit, a two-day evaluation of its programs and services by its funder, HRSA's Bureau of Primary Health Care.
