KHCN is the only Health Center Controlled Network (HCCN) dedicated 100% to Community Health Centers that operate in Kentucky and is uniquely positioned to help health centers improve clinical, financial, and operational practices that result in better health outcomes for the communities they serve. Access to training and technical assistance and all HCCN programming is available at no charge to participating health centers.

Established in 2012 and funded through HRSA's Bureau of Primary Health Care, KHCN is one of 49 funded HCCNs that work to strengthen member capacities and proficiencies in the following areas:
